## **Highlights**

- New ACSS working groups the ACSS met on the 15<sup>th</sup> October to discuss new working groups ideas. The following ideas are being scoped further:
  - o Climate change
  - Kitchen behaviours and practises

- "Understanding Food in a Digital World" on 9th November the FSA is hosting this ESRC 2020 festival event in partnership with the University of Sheffield. The COVID-19 outbreak has necessitated a move away from more traditional data collection methods and accelerated the innovative use of digital data. This event will demonstrate how digital data collection and analysis can inform our understanding of food, and outline key findings related to the digitalisation of food behaviours. - The FSA and FSS have published an assessment of food crime in the UK. The assessment identified priority areas to focus on and found that most food crime relates to two either of two broad activities:
  - selling something of little or no value to the food chain as edible and marketable,
  - selling passable food, drink or feed as a product with greater volume or more desirable attributes
